"Consent", by Jill Ciment. At 17, she fell in love with a 47-Year-Old. Now she questions the story. Jill Ciment's 1996 memoir "Half a Life" described her teenage affair with the man she eventually married. Her new memoir, "Consent," dramatically revises some details. A few years ago, Ciment found herself reconsidering their origin story. Mesches had died of leukemia in 2016, at age 93. The #MeToo movement had un-leashed a debate about sexual harassment and assault committed by men in positions of power. Ciment started to question her earlier account of their courtship.
