My goal is to look at and appreciate the scientific process as it takes us, over the period of 200 years, from Earth, Wind, Fire, and Water to the 118 chemical elements we recognize today. I was privileged to be part of a scientific consortium of Russian and United States Scientists that produced and observed Elements 113 thru 118. I get to claim partial credit for 116Livermorium, and 118Oganesson, as my name appears as a co-author on the definitive publication recognized by the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemist (IUPAC). How easy is it for a country to go from a democracy to a dictatorship? Why are so many countries attracted to dictators? Are partisan politics working? Why are democracies inefficient? Is American democracy on its way to a dictatorship? Political scientist Ethan Hollander has traveled the world to study governments similar to and different from our own. With case studies from Latin America, Africa, North America, Asia and Europe, we will learn what politics around the world now looks like and come to our own conclusions about the state and future of democracy. Why bird in the middle of the winter? Because there are many more birds that migrate into our area in the winter than in any other season. We will focus on bird identification, and more specifically, on identification of birds in our local area. In each class we will study about 10 different species of birds. Then, on the weekend following each class, we will go out to a nearby natural area and try to find these ten species. We will also find bonus birds that we haven't studied and identify them in the field. David Sibleys's "Field Guide to Birds of Western North. America" is recommended but not required. It would also be good to watch the video "Wings Over Our Two Counties" on You Tube before the class.
